




"TO AN UNKNOWN GOD"

- Epicureans held the belief that the purpose of life was to live to the flesh. Pleasure was the ultimate Good.
- Stoics, on the other hand, believed that the ultimate Good in life was to not be over taken by emotions or the flesh.
- Each day these two groups of philosophers would gather in the Areopagus and discuss different philosophies.
