# Why do we not use musically instruments in our worship?

- In the church, we have taught that our singing should be acapella.
  - Acapella in Latin literally means in the chapel
  - It is singing without the accompaniment of instrument.
  - Is acapella singing just a tradition?
- Let us take a look an important text:
  - Ephesians 5:17 – 21
  - To understand the passage there is two important things we need to understand about the verse:
    - “making melody”
    - “in your heart”
