God remembers Cornelius

ACTS 10:1 - 8

Acts 10:1 - 2 (ESV)

1 At Caesarea there was a man named Cornelius, a centurion of what was known as the Italian Cohort, 2 a devout man who feared God with all his household, gave alms generously to the people, and prayed continually to God.



Who was Cornelius?

- A Gentile
- ► A Soldier in Roman military
- ▶ He was the leader of at least 100 men.
- Notice how his character is described:
 - Devout
 - Feared God, along with his household
 - Donated generously to the needy
 - Prayed to God on a continual basis



Acts 10:3 - 4 (ESV)

3 About the ninth hour of the day he saw clearly in a vision an angel of God come in and say to him, "Cornelius." 4 And he stared at him in terror and said, "What is it, Lord?" And he said to him, "Your prayers and your alms have ascended as a memorial before God.

Does God hear the prayers of a sinner?

- Cornelius was not in a saved condition.
 - Acts 11:14
 - ▶ John 8:24
- God doesn't respond to the request of those who refuse to hear Him.
 - ▶ 1 Peter 3:12
 - ▶ Isaiah 59:1 2
- However, when someone is sincerely seeking Him He will reach to them.
 - ► Matthew 7:7 8
 - Acts 17:27

Acts 10:5 – 8 (ESV)

5 And now send men to Joppa and bring one Simon who is called Peter. 6 He is lodging with one Simon, a tanner, whose house is by the sea." 7 When the angel who spoke to him had departed, he called two of his servants and a devout soldier from among those who attended him, 8 and having related everything to them, he sent them to Joppa.



Peter is sent to the household of Cornelius

ACTS 10:9 - 33

Acts 10:9 (ESV)

9 The next day, as they were on their journey and approaching the city, Peter went up on the housetop about the sixth hour to pray.

Acts 10:10 - 12 (ESV)

10 And he became hungry and wanted something to eat, but while they were preparing it, he fell into a trance 11 and saw the heavens opened and something like a great sheet descending, being let down by its four corners upon the earth. 12 In it were all kinds of animals and reptiles and birds of the air.

Acts 10:13 – 16 (ESV)

13 And there came a voice to him: "Rise, Peter; kill and eat." 14 But Peter said, "By no means, Lord; for I have never eaten anything that is common or unclean." 15 And the voice came to him again a second time, "What God has made clean, do not call common." 16 This happened three times, and the thing was taken up at once to heaven.
